Below please find my recap of the Town Board Regular meeting held last night. I am editing to what I feel might be of interest to CRSE readers. Of course, you can catch all the action on Channel 8- a sure fire antidote to insomnia. Although the meeting was mercifully short as most Regular Meetings are.

As always the comments that follow are strictly my own utterly biased and uncalled for observations. In theory, the official minutes will be available on November 11th.

### REGULAR MEETING:

#### 4. Motion setting Meeting Dates:

November 4th: 7:30 Civic Center  
November 10th (Wednesday): 7:30 Lakeview Manor  
November 18th 7:30 Civic Center

#### 5. Motion Setting the Following Public Hearings:

November 4: 7:30 Civic Center Town of Southeast Budget  
November 10: 7:30 Lakeview Manor Historic Sites

#### 6. Motion- Authorizing Donation to Southeast Honor Roll Fund Drive

The Board voted 5-0 to donate \$5000 to the Honor Roll Project. It was also mentioned that Al Bergman of Supervisor Lifestyles was contributing an additional \$5000.

#### 8. Resolution- "Right Turn Only" Sodom/ Old Milltown Road- Local Law.

The Board voted 5-0 in favor of this resolution.

#### 10. Motion- Adoption of Rules and Regulations for the Town of Southeast Open Space Committee:

This will be a 7 member Board with one year terms. There will be a scoring system for land acquisition. All open space will be inventoried. Passed by the Board by a vote of 5-0.

**6. Honor Roll:**

Hey, and the strikingly designed Honor Roll would make a nice 'pocket park' for a newly constructed Town Hall.

**8. Right Turn Only Sodom Road/Old Milltown Road:**

As I've said before even 'Cats' had to close so I'm hoping against hope that we won't see this goody back on the agenda in my lifetime. Oh yeah... but then if they widen Route 22 does this rear its ugly little head yet again?

**10. Adoption of Rules and Regulations for the Town of Southeast Open Space Committee:**

While the Town Board takes great pride in announcing that all items on the agenda have been discussed in public- well, not so on this piece of legislation. And it might have been nice and instructive for residents to have had some input on this. Fresh ideas and all that.

**11. Open Space Appointments:**

In the spirit of true bitterness, here's where I have to disclose that I did submit a resume and letter of intent to be considered for this Board. Not only did I not make the new Committee but tragically finished in under the 50th percentile. 13 interviewed with seven making the cut.
